# 2006 Yellow Jacket Volleyball Season Preview



Last season saw the DC Yellow Jacket Volleyball Team compile a 21-12 finish last season in which the Jackets advanced to the HCAC Championship Finals. Although the team could not pull out the victory, the pieces are in place for Defiance to make a run at its first conference championship.

This season's Yellow Jacket team is comprised of a lot of veteran leadership, as evidenced by the four seniors on the team. Among the seniors include **Danielle Rego (Toledo, OH – Bowsher/Owens CC)**, the transfer who earned First Team All-HCAC honors in her first season as a Yellow Jacket. **Corrie Farley (Berkey, OH – Evergreen)** and **Diane Bruns (Maria Stein, OH – Marion Local)** will look to continue to provide a strong defensive presence on the floor, as the two were first and second

on the team in digs, respectively. Rounding out the class is **Libby Creps (Waldo, OH – River Valley)**, another fourth year player who has already lettered thrice and will undoubtedly be called upon to impart her experience on the younger players.

Taking over the setting duties will be **Brittany Cooley (Toledo, OH – Cardinal Stritch)**, the lone junior of the team. Returning for their second season on the Jacket squad are **Lauren Aldridge (Ypsilanti, MI – Lincoln)**, **Kyla Holmes (Hanover, MI – Hanover-Horton)**, and **Shannon O'Dell (Pennville, IN – Jay County)**. The three each made substantial contributions to the Yellow Jackets during their first year at Defiance.

All of these returning players will be looked upon to fill the void left by **Julie Steineman (DC '06 – New Bremen, OH)** and **Jill Evans (DC '05 – Wauseon, OH)**, who each made the All-HCAC First Team last season. Looking to step up and replace those players are five incoming freshman, namely **Maggie Dusbiber (Chelsea, MI - Chelsea)**, **Ashton Judis (Livonia, MI - Stevenson)**, **Danyel Lipps (West Alexandria, OH - Twin Valley South)**, **Chantille Millender (Lorain, OH - Lorain Southview)**, and **Nicole Williams (Trenton, MI - Oscar A. Carlson)**. Both Dusbiber and Judis were all-conference selections during their high school playing careers.

**Head Coach David Kwan** hopes to keep his streak of success alive, as Kwan looks to achieve his fourth consecutive 20-win season. In 2003, he was named HCAC Coach of the Year after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 26-5 overall record and 6-1 conference record.

In 2004, Diane Bruns became one of the Yellow Jackets two primary setters, playing in 111 games. She ended the season second on the team in assists with 557, while also serving up 40 aces. This past season, Bruns took over the libero position with exceptional results. She placed second on the team in digs with 417 in 117 games. She also had 47 service aces, third best on the Yellow Jacket squad. Bruns never played a match last season without getting at least one dig and even had an eight match streak in which she averaged 19.1 digs per match. In one of those matches, she dug a season-high 29 balls in a 3-2 win over Baldwin-Wal-lace on October 1.

Libby Creps enters her fourth season as a Yellow Jacket, with 130 games of experience in the past three years. Last season, Creps totaled 20 kills, 11 digs and nine blocks in 30 games for the Yellow Jackets. She had an eight-kill, four-dig effort in the first match of the season, a 3-2 win over Waynesburg. In 2004, she played in 81 games, with 70 kills, 57 digs, and 16 blocks to show for her efforts. Creps had an eight-kill, seven-dig effort in the last match of the season on October 30 against Wheaton. During her freshman season, she took part in 14 games and contributed a kill and two digs in a win against Brescia on October 18.

Corrie Farley became a regular starter for the first time in 2004, as she played in 115 games, starting in 28 of 33 matches. By season's end, she finished with 177 kills, 36 aces, and a team-leading 532 digs. Last season, Farley led the team in digs yet again, this time tallying 476 for the year. She was also third on the team in kills with 176. As one of the DC cornerstones, she was one of three Yellow Jackets to play in 125 games in 2005. Her best match was on September 10, when she totaled 16 kills and 20 digs in a 3-1 win over Heidelberg.

In her first season at Defiance College, Danielle Rego made a significant impact on the team, finishing the year second on the team in kills and blocks with 402 and 72, respectively, in 125 games. Her play during the season was good enough to be recognized as a First Team All-HCAC selection. She had at least three kills in every match played, and put up double-digits in kills over the last ten matches of the year, averaging 17.8 per match. One of those matches was a 29-kill, 10-dig effort in a 3-2 win over Aquinas on October 29. During her two-year stint at Owens Community College, she helped the Lady Express to a 35-13 record and a perfect 12-0 OCCAC conference finish in 2004 under head coach Sonny Lewis. Her performance during the season led her to be named to the All-Conference OCCAC First Team.

Brittany Cooley spent most of last season as a backup to All-HCAC setter Jill Evans (DC '05), but was given her chance to shine when Evans went down with an ankle injury in the semifinals of the HCAC Tournament against Franklin. With 28 assists in the match, Cooley helped lead DC from a 2-1 deficit to a 3-2 win to advance to the finals.

During the season, Cooley handed out 331 assists – second on the team – while reaching double digits in 12 matches, including a 47-assist, 11-dig match against Gallaudet on September 24. As a freshman, Cooley played in 16 games during the 2004 season. Though she only had one kill and 13 digs during her time playing, she handed out 39 assists in the matches that she played.

## Head Coach David Kwan

David Kwan enters his fourth season as head coach of the Defiance College Volleyball Team. In his first season, Kwan won the 2003 HCAC Coach of the Year Award for leading the Lady Jackets to a school-record 26-5 mark. Over the past three years, Kwan has compiled a .687 winning percentage, which is the highest in school history for coaches who have coached at least 60 matches for Defiance.

Kwan came to the Yellow Jacket Volleyball program from Toronto, Ontario, where he served as assistant men's volleyball coach at Humber College. During the 2002-03 season, Kwan helped lead the Hawks to the school's first undefeated regular season and a top-four finish in the Ontario Colleges Athletic Association Championship.

Prior to Humber College, Kwan was an assistant women's volleyball coach at York University. Kwan volunteered as head coach of the boys' volleyball team of Toronto West Volleyball Club from 1997-2002 and as head coach of the Elite Summer Regional Team of Ontario from 1998-2001, earning bronze in 2000 and gold in 2001.

During his coaching career, Kwan has had a hand in producing seven all-conference players at Defiance College and one athlete playing with the Canadian National Team. Kwan has instructed physical education courses at York University and was a personal trainer and strength & conditioning coach at the Sports Clubs of Canada-Plaza Club. In addition, Kwan has coached both the 15 and 16 national travel teams for Premier Volleyball for the last two years, having recently qualified the 16-1 team for the Junior Olympics National Tournament in Atlanta this past summer. He has run camps for the University of Michigan, Bowling Green State University, Premier Elite camp, and local high schools in the Northwest Ohio area.



Kwan earned an Honors Bachelor of Arts degree in Kinesiology and Health Sciences from York University in 1999 and a Master of Kinesiology in Coaching degree from York in 2001 also in Toronto. At York, he helped develop some of the top volleyball athletes in the province of Ontario, placing four athletes on the All-Canadian All-Stars.

Amanda Hayman joins the DC Volleyball Team for her first year as a graduate assistant coach. A 2006 graduate of Northwood University, Hayman was a two-sport athlete, having played volleyball in her senior year in addition to four years of softball. As a second baseman for the Timberwolves, she was captain of the softball team in her junior and senior years, with the team winning the conference in her junior year. Hayman gained all-GLIAC honorable mention honors in each of those two seasons and also in her senior year for volleyball. In addition, she was also an academic all-conference honorable mention in volleyball. Hayman holds the distinction as the only athlete in Northwood history to earn all-conference honors in two sports.

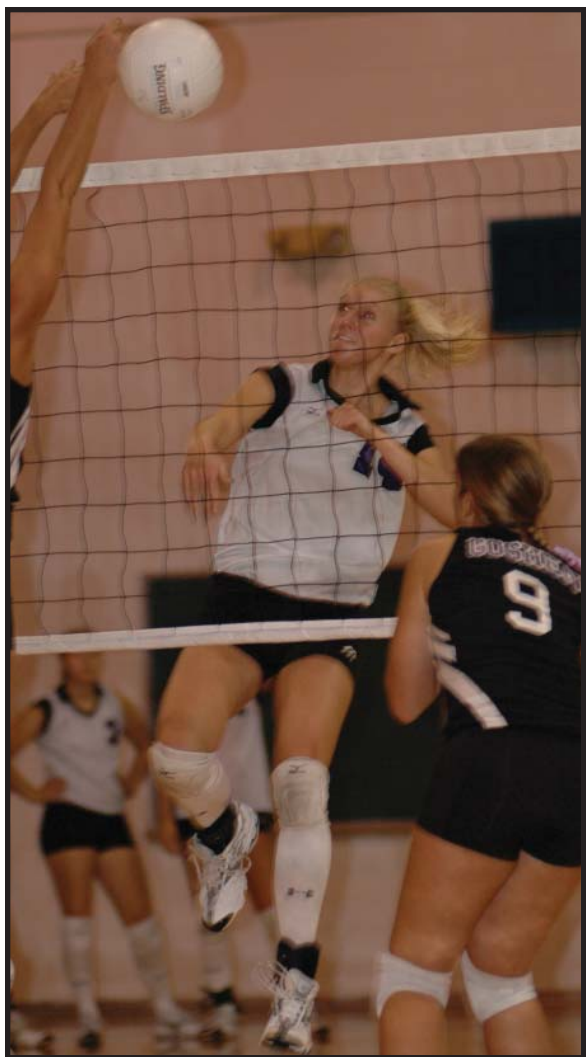
