How do I enroll in a summer course?

First-time students and/or transfer students must apply to the college.

- ◆ Adult undergraduate degree seeking (typically 23 years of age and older), graduate students, non-degree seeking, or transient students* visit:

- ◆ Traditional age students (18 – 22 years of age) degree seeking, non-degree seeking or transient students* visit:

***Transient students (visiting students)** A transient student must submit a statement of good standing from the institution at which he/she is currently enrolled as a degree student. This statement should indicate that the student is in good standing and has permission to take courses at Defiance to transfer back to the home institution. There is a \$25 transient student fee.

DC students currently enrolled in good standing are automatically eligible to schedule for summer classes. To schedule for classes, contact your advisor for course approval and submit your schedule to the Registrar's Office, Serrick Campus Center Room 204 or the Center for Adult and Graduate Programs (CAP) in Defiance Hall Office 104.

DC students previously enrolled in good standing are automatically eligible to schedule for summer classes. A re-enrollment form must be completed and submitted to the Registrar's Office for approval. Re-enrollment forms are available online at *http://www.defiance.edu/media/RC_Re-enrollment_form.pdf* or contact the Registrar or CAP Office.

How do I complete the registration process?

You must submit a signed billing statement prior to attending class regardless of whether you have a zero balance, credit balance, or have loans in process. Student bills are due and payable in full to either the Business or CAP Office on or before each session's start date. Students must submit financial aid verification documents, if applicable, before classes begin. Financial aid cannot be processed for students required to submit verification documents until the paperwork is completed and submitted to the Financial Aid (FA) Office.

What is the withdrawal and refund policy?

A student who registers for a course and then wishes to withdraw from the course must contact the Registrar's Office at 419.783.2551 or the Center for Adult and Graduate Programs (CAP) office at 419.783.2351 to complete the appropriate "drop" form. The college's refund policy is based on each session's start date and notification of withdrawal. The refund is calculated from the date of contact by the student to these designated offices. Changes in enrollment may affect financial aid eligibility. You must contact the FA Office immediately at 419.783.2376 or financialaid@defiance.edu regarding your enrollment changes.

What financial aid resources are available in the summer?

Students who would like to be considered for grants and loans must complete the 2010 - 2011 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. The first step is to apply for a Personal Identification Number (called a PIN) at www.pin.ed.gov. The PIN serves as your electronic signature on the FAFSA. Secondly, complete the FAFSA by going to www.fafsa.gov. After you are online please include Defiance College's Title IV number 003041. To be considered for grants and loans, students must be degree seeking and meet any additional eligibility requirements.
